- Goal is to increase Kansans access to fresh, healthy food
- Provide seed money for new community gardens
- 3 year project (2012, 2013, 2014)





- Up to \$5,000 in grant money for a new garden
- Requests come from community garden organizations
- Gardens will <u>openly accessible</u> to members of community
- Emphasis on <u>food production</u>
 - May be allotment gardens or communal gardens





- Applications received once a year
- Include overview of project
- Demonstrate need for grant funds
- Include organizational documents
 - By-laws
 - Garden rules
 - Budget
 - Garden map





What do we fund??

- Start-up expenses
- Do not fund ongoing expenses
- WILL NOT fund a Garden Manager or paid gardeners
- One time award. Not renewable unless you expand into another site or add a LARGE number of new plots.





- What are Start-up Expenses? Site preparation, irrigation costs (drill well, run water lines, etc.), fences, storage shed, large equipment (tiller, mower, etc.), hand tools, etc.
- What are Ongoing Expenses? Monthly water or electric bills; annual seeds/transplants





How are grants awarded?

- Screening Committee
 - University and Extension Staff
 - Individuals with Community Gardening Experience
- Scoring Process
 - Score Sheet—Points allotted for sections of application
 - Some additional points for gardens located in "food desert"

*** Recipients must agree to complete reporting of the their spending and activities.





How Have We Made a Difference?



How Have We Made a Difference?

- After two years
 - \$250,000 distributed to 59 gardens
 - 1,170 new allotment plots
 - 452,995 sq. ft. of space in communal gardens
 - 859,153 sq. ft. in new community garden projects
 - 3,500+ individuals have participated in community garden projects





What kind of gardens?

- Small-Medium-Large
- Allotment-Communal-School
- Urban-Suburban-Rural
- All parts of the state
- Not all gardens asked for or received total \$5,000 limit










Allotment Gardens— Individuals/Families Rent Plot

What have we funded

- Site preparation
- Bed construction
- Fences
- Sheds
- Drilling wells
- Irrigation lines
- Irrigation equipment

- Tillers and mowers
- Hand tools
- Garden benches and tables
- Soil improvements (compost, manure, etc.)





Why have we rejected an application

- Doesn't meet goal of project—not a food garden or a community garden
- Incomplete applications
- Not a new garden
- Request items we can't fund, such as a paid garden manager
- Poorly developed plans





What we have learned

- Tremendous need for funding of new and existing gardens
- Some groups have never applied for a grant before
- Some people don't understand the concept of a "community" garden
- Great appreciation for the funds received





2014

- Last year of the grant
- \$150,000 available to be awarded
- Applications are due January 15, 2014
- Plan to report on the total project at the end of the 2014
